A small number of people sometimes show no respect for NHS staff and verbally or physically abuse them. This is wrong. It can be devastating for the professionals who are abused. It also affects the quality of NHS care.

What is abuse?

Abuse is not only physical violence. Shouting and harassment which causes staff distress is also abuse. This behaviour is unacceptable.

Respect

NHS staff deserve respect and like anyone should be able to do their jobs and care for people without being shouted at, harassed or physically assaulted.

If people choose to abuse NHS staff, they can be punished. They could even go to prison.

It does not matter if people are drunk or on illegal drugs. There is no excuse for violent or abusive behaviour towards those who dedicate themselves to caring for the public.

Penalties for abuse include:

- » Imprisonment
- » Police cautions with a record
- » Fines
